

**CANDIDATES' INFORMATION CALENDAR  
GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION – APRIL 7, 2009**

**JAN. 8 – JAN. 29**

**FILING PERIOD FOR NOMINATION PAPERS**

Between these days (both days included), **during normal office hours, as posted**, voters may nominate candidates for election by signing a nomination paper. Each candidate shall be proposed by not less than 100 registered voters (20 for candidates for Board of Education) qualified to vote for that office at the next city General Election. No voter may sign more than one nomination paper for the same office, and in the event he/she does so, his/her signature shall count only on the first nomination paper filed which contains his/her signature. Nomination papers subsequently filed and containing his/her signature shall be considered as though his/her signature does not appear thereon. **Each seat on the governing body is a separate office.** Any person registered to vote at the Glendale election may circulate a nomination paper. Registered voters in the School/College District may circulate nomination papers for candidates for the Board of Education and College Board of Trustees.

(§ 1.08.030(A) Glendale Municipal Code)

Nomination papers for candidates for the office of Councilmember, City Clerk, City Treasurer, member of the Board of Education, and member of the Glendale Community College Board of Trustees, shall be issued by the City Clerk after a declaration of candidacy has been filed by the candidate with the City Clerk. Such declaration of candidacy shall state:

- a) His/her residence, with street and number, if any;
- b) His/her election precinct;
- c) The name of the office for which he/she is a candidate;
- d) That he/she will not withdraw as a candidate before the election, if nominated; and
- e) That if elected, he/she will qualify for the office.

(§ 1.08.020 Glendale Municipal Code)

A filing fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be paid to the City Clerk for filing Declaration of Candidacy, except that no filing fee shall be required from any candidate for an office to the holder of which no compensation is payable. (§ 1.08.040 Glendale Municipal Code)

**JAN. 8 – JAN. 29**

**CANDIDATE'S STATEMENT** (voluntary)

Candidate's Statements are filed at the time of filing Nomination Papers. A statement may be withdrawn but not changed during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. on the day following the close of nomination. The statements are **CONFIDENTIAL** until the expiration of the filing deadline. A \$1,500.00 deposit is required at the time of filing the Candidate's Statement.

Following the close of filing of Nomination Papers, there is a ten-day public review period of Candidate's Statements.

**JAN. 29 (5:30 pm)**

**LAST DAY TO FILE NOMINATION PAPERS**

This is the last day and hour to file Nomination Papers.

- FEB. 3 (5:30 pm)**      **EXTENSION**  
This extension only applies if incumbents have not filed Nomination Papers as of the nomination deadline of January 29. (See “Filing Nomination Papers.”)
- JAN. 30**                      **ORDER OF NAMES ON BALLOT**  
A randomized alphabet drawing is conducted by the Secretary of State which determines the order the Candidates’ names will appear on the ballot. **The drawing will take place on February 4 if incumbents do not file by the January 29 deadline.**
- FEB. 9 – MAR. 24**      **WRITE-IN CANDIDATE**  
During this period, any person who desires to have his or her name as written on the ballot of the election counted shall file a Statement of Write-In Candidacy which shall contain the candidate’s name, residence address, a declaration stating that he or she is a write-in candidate, the title of the office for which he or she is running, the date of the election and a nominating petition with the required number of signatures.
- FEB. 26**                      **CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS (1<sup>st</sup> Pre-election)**  
Last day for each candidate and each committee supporting or opposing a candidate or candidates or supporting or opposing a ballot measure or ballot measures to file campaign statements with the Elections Official. Statement covers period through February 21, 2009.
- MAR. 9 – MAR. 31**      **VOTE-BY-MAIL VOTER APPLICATIONS**  
Between these dates, any voter entitled to vote by vote-by-mail vote ballot may file a application for a vote-by-mail voter ballot with the Election Official.
- MAR. 23**                      **VOTER REGISTRATION CLOSES**  
**LAST DAY TO REGISTER TO VOTE FOR THE APRIL 7, 2009 ELECTION.**
- MAR. 26**                      **CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS (2<sup>nd</sup> Pre-election)**  
Last day for each candidate and each committee supporting or opposing a candidate or candidates or supporting or opposing a ballot measure or ballot measures to file campaign statements with the Elections Official. Statement covers period of February 22, 2009 through March 21, 2009).
- APR. 7**                        **ELECTION DAY**  
Polls open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- APR. 20**                      **CANVASS OF ELECTION RETURNS & DECLARATION OF RESULTS OF ELECTION**
- APR. 20**                      **SWEARING-IN CEREMONY**  
8:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers

**MAY 20**

**STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS**

Last day for every person elected to the City Council and every person leaving those offices to file the Statement.

**JULY 31, 2009**

**LAST DAY TO FILE CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE STATEMENT  
(THIRD & FINAL)**

Last day for each candidate and each committee supporting or opposing a candidate or candidates or supporting or opposing a ballot measure or ballot measures to file campaign statements with the Elections Official. Statement covers period of March 22, 2009 through June 30, 2009).
