

CITY ATTORNEY'S IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE C

This Measure is submitted to the voters by the Glendale City Council to amend the Charter to remove obsolete language and provide for the change of the official title from director of administrative services to director of finance.

Currently, the Charter requires that the Council by ordinance provide for petty cash funds for payment in cash of expenditures provided for in the budgets that cannot conveniently and economically be paid otherwise. This amendment will eliminate this requirement, and instead allow for proposes to require that such petty cash payments to be charged against budgeted line items, pursuant to the budget process.

The Charter further requires that, on or before the first day of June of each year, the city manager must submit to the council a proposed budget. The Charter does not provide for a date by which the budget must be adopted. The proposed amendment remove the requirement to submit a proposed by budget by June 1, and replace it with a requirement that a budget be adopted by June 30 of each year.

The Charter requires that bonds be sold only at a public sale, and that if no satisfactory bid is received, the council may reject all bids received, and thereafter sell said bonds at public or private sale. The amendment provides that the bonds may be sold either through a negotiated or a competitive process as determined by the Council.
